Program Title: Summer Youth Employment Program
Application: Will be released on March 1

<u>Program Summary:</u> Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) is the nation's largest youth employment program, connecting NYC youth between the ages of 14 and 24 with career exploration opportunities and paid work experience each summer. Participants have the opportunity to explore their interests and career pathways, develop workplace skills and engage in learning experiences that help in developing their social, civic and leadership skills. By participating in structured project-based learning and work-based opportunities, NYC youth are better prepared for careers of the future.

Special programming available for NYC youth through SYEP

- NYC Teens aged 14-15 can participate in paid project based learning activities which will help them explore different career opportunities
- Young people aged 16-21 can apply for paid Summer Jobs in a variety of industries throughout NYC

Program Title: Applied Research Innovations in Science and Engineering (ARISE) Application Deadline: March 1st, 2022 at 11:59 PM

*Approximately 60-66 placements are available for the summer of 2022.

Program Summary: This free selective program is for academically strong, current 10th and 11th grade New York City students with a demonstrated interest in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM). This full-time, seven week program includes: College level workshops and seminars, a high level research experience in participating NYU faculty labs, and mentoring in that placement by a graduate or postdoctoral student. In the seminars and workshops, students will be introduced to the scientific method and ethics, data collection and analysis, research practices and lab safety. Students will also receive hands-on experience in labs, as well as training in presentation and public speaking.

Program Summary: A free, three-week, full-day summer program providing an introduction for high school women on the fundamentals of cyber security and computer science at the NYU Tandon School of Engineering. Program Title: High School Initiative in Remote Sensing of the Earth Systems Science & Engineering (HIRES)

Application Deadline: March 31st, 2022

Up to 25 placements are available for the summer program

<u>Program Summary:</u> HIRES provides an advanced STEM research opportunity to New York City students with little or no access to high quality STEM education experiences. Students from demographic groups traditionally underrepresented in STEM disciplines and careers, including women, students of color and those from low income backgrounds, are strongly encouraged to apply.

The 7-week program (July through August), integrates pre-college credit courses (computer analysis; GIS and Remote Sensing – 3 credits); hands-on research; along with learning modules in Earth Sciences and Engineering (ESE). Students participate in field trips during the course of the program, and present their research at the end of the summer program at CUNY STEM Summer Research Symposium.

<u>Program Summary:</u> Girls Who Code is **offering two free** programs in the summer. Applicants can apply for BOTH programs however, students can only participate in one Summer Program. **The Summer Immersion Program** is a virtual, 2 week introductory Computer Science course, and no previous experience is required. Participants learn web development with HTML, CSS, and JavaScript while getting an inside look into the tech industry through incredible company partners

Program Summary: The Science Research Mentoring Program at the American Museum of Natural History (AMNH) is an opportunity for NYC high school students to conduct **one year (August 2022 - June 2023)** of scientific research with AMNH scientists. High school students get paid to conduct research and work with peers and scientist mentors twice a week throughout the school year (4hrs/week) on a project that has never been done before.
